Leadership is critical to a great outcome, whether in design thinking, on a major construction site or in leading a city department. The Future Cities Leadership Institute (FCLi) has developed expertise and a training course across the architecture, design and planning disciplines that will give participants the basics to become a leader in the development of sustainable cities.

The unprecedented speed and scale of urbanisation in the first half of the 21st century has fundamental implications for urban development. From climate change to public health and social cohesion, food security and urban resilience, governments and municipalities around the world are increasingly concerned with the sustainable provision of food, water, energy, housing, transport and services to urban populations.

However, there is a lack of expertise, coordination and leadership in how to deliver on the New Urban Agenda. The FCLi is therefore working with stakeholders to improve international knowledge exchange and leadership in the area, offering expertise, strategic advice and relevant training courses (coaching and training for Senior Executive City Leaders).

Good leadership is always more than 'Management'. It is collaborative, entrepreneurial and visionary.

The FCLi is working to up-skill leadership capabilities of experts, architects and public servants in city and planning departments to make the transition to a more urbanised and climate-adapted world both sustainable and equitable.

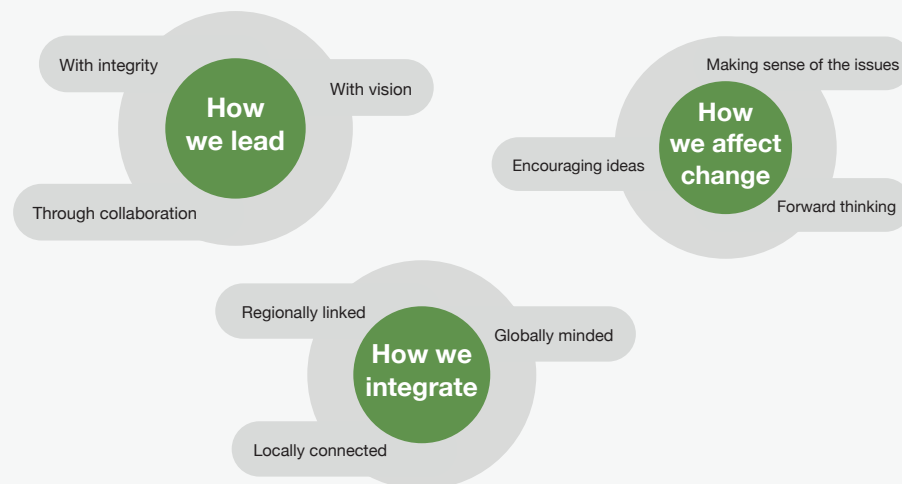

WHAT WE DO

Professor Steffen Lehmann, an internationally renowned expert in sustainable cities, established the Future Cities Leadership Institute to facilitate consensus on how to resolve some of the key challenges facing cities – for a sustainable urban future, providing the leadership required to achieve the development goals.

The FCLi was created to address the critical challenges facing cities, particularly the question of how to sustain clean growth and the health of the environment, while up-skilling leadership capabilities and advancing urban development goals.

Steffen Lehmann is a German-Australian senior academic in architecture and urbanism. He is a researcher, thought leader and strategic cities advocate dedicated to resolve social, environmental, economic and technological challenges that are redefining the operating system of cities this century.

The Future Cities Leadership Institute is working with a range of other eminent experts and involves them in consultancy and training courses as appropriate.

Professor Steffen Lehmann has advised over a dozen cities on sustainable urban development, including: Berlin, Stuttgart, Dresden, Shanghai, Singapore, Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide, Abu Dhabi, Ho-Chi-Minh City, Oslo and Helsinki. He was a consultant to Rio Tinto (Australia) and an External Advisor to UNESCO, UN-ESCAP and the Inter-American Development Bank (IADB) on sustainable urban development. The Minister for Planning NSW, The Hon Frank Sartor appointed him as member of the Reference Panel for the urban regeneration of Newcastle (NSW).



Throughout my career, I was privileged to work on numerous high profile projects: I designed and built significant projects in historically important places, such as at Potsdamer Platz, Hackescher Markt and Pariser Platz in Berlin, generating lasting public value for cities and high-profile clients.

Urban Research and Design

Buildings, places and neighbourhoods are always designed in team work. They need to be enjoyable, resource-efficient and work well over time. This means that they have lasting qualities and make a positive contribution to their context and user-experience.

However, the biggest issue that stops cities from advancing their ideas or projects is the lack of leadership and commitment to the agenda. Gaining political and public buy-in is key to developing capacity and skills within any city council to initiate and deliver sustainable city projects at scale and to develop capacity within (federal, state or local) government, and to enable the change of 'siloed' departments.

Strategic Leadership

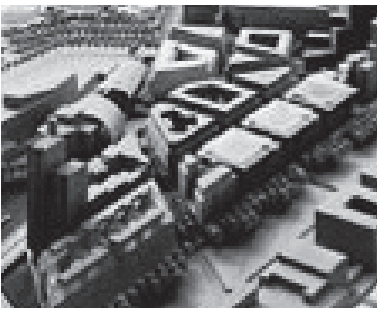
Steffen Lehmann is a strategic leader and has led groups of over 120 academics, re-positioning large and complex groups of people. He is the former UNESCO Chair for Sustainable Urban Development in the Asia-Pacific and has published over 18 books.

LEADERSHIP

Research Leadership

Before establishing the interdisciplinary FCLi Institute, Steffen Lehmann has been Founding Director of 3 successful new research centres at universities, in the UK and in Australia:

Leadership in Urban Regeneration



Steffen Lehmann was in charge of large urban regeneration projects in Germany, Australia and China, leading the strategic design and development of complex inner-city renewal. Some of these complicated urban developments took over ten years to be built, including:

- From 1993 to 2003, Steffen Lehmann was involved with his practice as one of the lead architects of the Potsdamer Platz development (Daimler site) in Berlin. He worked from the initial concept plans to completion and was in charge of buildings C2 and C3. This work involved close masterplan coordination with architects Renzo Piano Building Workshop and numerous other interest groups. In the 1990s, this was Europe's most important construction site.

- From 1994 to 2002: Steffen Lehmann led the urban regeneration of the area South of Hackescher Markt in Berlin, including the urban design of the Quartier an der Museumsinsel, the introduction of the light railway station and the headquarters of the Bundesverband Deutscher Banken and the Deutscher Gewerkschaftsbund.



The complexity of urban systems and the global sustainability challenges that society is facing requires inter-and transdisciplinary research that combines context-sensitive approaches to inform integrated solutions.



- From 2006 to 2011: Steffen led the urban renewal of the city centre of the city of Newcastle (NSW, Australia), which included the removal of 2.5km heavy railway line that separated the city centre from the waterfront, and the introduction of a new light railway system. The masterplan's implementation took until 2019, with the opening of new Wickham terminus station in 2017.
